ROLLED PAPER BEADS

Whether you use chiyogami, hand decorated papers, glossy magazine pages or comic books, these beads are a great addition to your paper crafting projects.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- ·decorative paper
- ·bamboo skewers or round tooth picks
- ·white glue that dries clear or glaze like Judikins Diamond GlazeTM
- ·wax paper
- ·clean, damp cloth


METHOD



Cut your paper into strips. I generally use a piece about $6'' \times \frac{1}{2}$ " (15.2 cm x 1.3 cm) or larger. Taper each strip so that it looks like a long triangle. You can have a pointed end or a blunt end.



Starting at the wide end, roll the strip tightly around the skewer with the wrong side of the paper touching the skewer. Run a thin bead of glue down the center of the strip and continue rolling to the end. The glue will get squished out across the paper as you roll.



Seal the edges of the bead by rubbing in any of the excess glue that has seeped out.



- Slide the bead off the skewer onto the waxed paper. Before making another bead, wipe the skewer with a damp cloth so the next bead doesn't stick to the skewer.
- When the beads are dry you can slide them back onto a skewer and coat them with varathane or gloss medium. I use Judikins Diamond Glaze™ to make the beads so that I can skip this step because the excess glaze that seeps out coats the outside of the bead when I rub it in along the edges.
